

Shriners Can Tab Program

There is a blue collection bin in Fellowship Hall for aluminum can tabs. The tabs are sold to a recycling company and the money collected is used to fund transportation for needy children to and from Shriners Hospitals. Please save only aluminum can tabs. Pull tabs from soup cans, canned fruit, pasta, etc. are steel and have to be separated out.

Shriners Hospitals for Children is a health care system of 22 hospitals dedicated to improving the lives of children by providing pediatric specialty care, innovative research, and outstanding teaching programs for medical professionals. Children up to age 18 with orthopedic conditions, burns, spinal cord injuries, and cleft lip and palate are eligible for care and receive all services in a family-centered environment, regardless of the patients' ability to pay. Any child, regardless of race, religion or national origin is eligible for care at Shriners Hospital. There is no need to have an affiliation with a Shriner or be related to one. For more information about the Shriners and Shriners Hospitals for Children, visit www.shrinersinternational.org.

Stamps for the Wounded (SFTW) is a service organization dedicated to providing comfort and stimulating activity to US veterans through stamp collecting. September Virtual Study Group



I urge you to consider joining this truly life and ministry transforming experience. Retired Katahdin District Superintendent, Rev. Dr. Jackie Brannen, and my administrative assistant. Brenda Cayer, will be your hosts for this journey arranged by Educational Opportunities (EO).

After walking in the footsteps of Jesus, the liturgical seasons will come alive for you as never before. Imagine standing on the Shepherd's Field hearing angels proclaiming Jesus' birth, kneeling before the birthplace of our Lord, or renewing our baptismal promises on the Jordan River where John the Baptist baptized Christ.

You will find yourself sitting on the actual steps where Jesus taught. I imaging you picturing Jesus walking on the water to you while sailing on the Sea of Galilee or praying in the Garden of Gethsemane while his disciples slept. You will be able to enter the tomb to discover it is indeed empty!

Each site will deepen your faith and evoke new emotions as you pause to reflect on the corresponding scripture and tour guide's explanations.





Godly, biblical wisdom is more valuable than gold or silver. Make this do-it-yourself toy to practice your searching skills.


What you need:

What you do:

- 2. Paint all sides of the rocks and carton. Let dry. Add a second coat, if desired.
- 3. When rocks are dry, number each rock (1-12) with marker. Place rocks in the carton.
- 4. Play hide-and-seek with a friend. Take turns hiding the rocks in a room, sandbox or backyard. Give clues, if needed, and count the rocks as they're returned.
- Use your imagination to incorporate a treasure hunt into study time or family devotions.
