

# Pastor's Message

"Pray, then, in this way:
Our Father in heaven,
may your name be revered as holy.
May your kingdom come.
May your will be done
on earth as it is in heaven.
Give us today our daily bread.
And forgive us our debts,
as we also have forgiven our debtors.
And do not bring us to the time of trial,
but rescue us from the evil one."
Matthew 6:9-13

A few weeks ago, our administrative assistant/Sunday School director/all around amazing human, Robin House, noticed that during Communion the children did not really know The Lord's Prayer as we were praying it in worship. She decided in the new year that it would be a good thing to teach our children, so she found a beautiful children's book on The Lord's Prayer written by Rev. Adam Hamilton (a UMC pastor and author). When Robin told me this story, I thought "what a perfect opportunity for ALL of us to learn the Lord's Prayer!" So we found a worship series and book study for adults also written by Rev. Adam Hamilton that we will follow along with up until the season of Lent.

Now you may be saying to yourself, "but Pastor Annie, I already know the Lord's Prayer by heart!" To which I would respond, "of course you do! BUT do you really KNOW what you are praying when you recite the words from memory? Do you FEEL the prayer in your heart every time as you lift it up to God?" Answering for myself, I would say "not always." When things like prayers become such an ingrained part of our faith and religious rituals, they often lose meaning for us because we don't actually process what we are saying anymore.

I would invite you in this new year, to make a new commitment to The Lord's Prayer as we engage with it over a 6-week worship series and book study. Bring a child-like wonder to the prayer along with our children who will also be learning it. Try praying it daily (if you don't already), but don't just say the words to say them; spend time with this prayer and really mean it and know it and feel it. The New Year is a great time to reassess our practices and habits, faith included! So join us for worship on Sundays this season to unpack The Lord's Prayer, and learn even more through our weekly virtual book study on Wednesday nights at 7pm on Zoom. Books are available in the church office for purchase (\$17; or talk with Pastor Annie if you need help with funding). May this new year fill you with the daily bread you need. Amen.



# Book Study: The Lord's Prayer by Adam Hamilton


Wednesdays January 10, 17, 24, 31, and February 7



# **SMALL BLESSINGS**



Geodes look plain on the outside but contain beautiful crystals. Create these "rocks" to show how God makes us new on the inside.

#### What you need:

- Clean cardboard egg carton
- Scissors (and adult help)
- Epsom salt
- Plastic zippered bags (one per color of dye)
- Food coloring
- Glue
- Paintbrush



#### What you do:

- 1. Cut out the tops and bottoms of all the egg compartments so you can make 6 ball shapes.
- 2. In each bag, put 3 tablespoons of Epsom salt and a drop or two of food coloring. Seal and shake to mix.
- 3. With the paintbrush, spread glue inside two egg-carton halves. Sprinkle a spoonful of Epsom salt into those halves. Then close and shake.
- 4. Open your homemade geode and shake out excess salt.
- 5. Optional: Preserve the crystals with
