

Pastor's Message



Beginning on Friday, April 19th, United Methodist delegates will be gathering from all around the world in Charlotte, NC for the postponed General Conference (which was supposed to take place in 2020). For those of you who don't know or need a reminder, General Conference is the global meeting of our denomination (usually every four years) when international delegates from around the globe gather to decide the future of our denomination — what we say we believe, how we spend our money, who we aspire to be in the world. I was recently reminded by a colleague that "To the world, our actions this April, like it or not, will say something about Christ and his followers."

For the first week of the General Conference, committees will meet to go through hundreds of legislative documents to bring to the floor of GC the following week. I served as an alternate lay delegate for New England at GC 2012, so I know just how many hours delegates spend reading, writing, praying, and discussing these documents. Then, during the second week of GC, the committees of delegates will bring the legislation that makes it through committee to the floor for all delegates to vote on.

Here are some of the major legislation up for discussion and vote this GC:

- A revision of our Social Principles
- Regionalizing our church structure to correct our colonialist US-centric rules
- A 50% budget decrease due to disafilliations and a natural decline of the universal church

Please be in prayer not only for our own delegation from New England Conference, but for all delegates attending GC2020. Also be in prayer for The United Methodist Church as a whole as the decisions made at GC will impact us on a local level.






Looking Ahead to VBS 2024 July 19 and 20, 2024

This year's VBS theme is Camp Firelight: A Summer Camp Adventure with God.






