

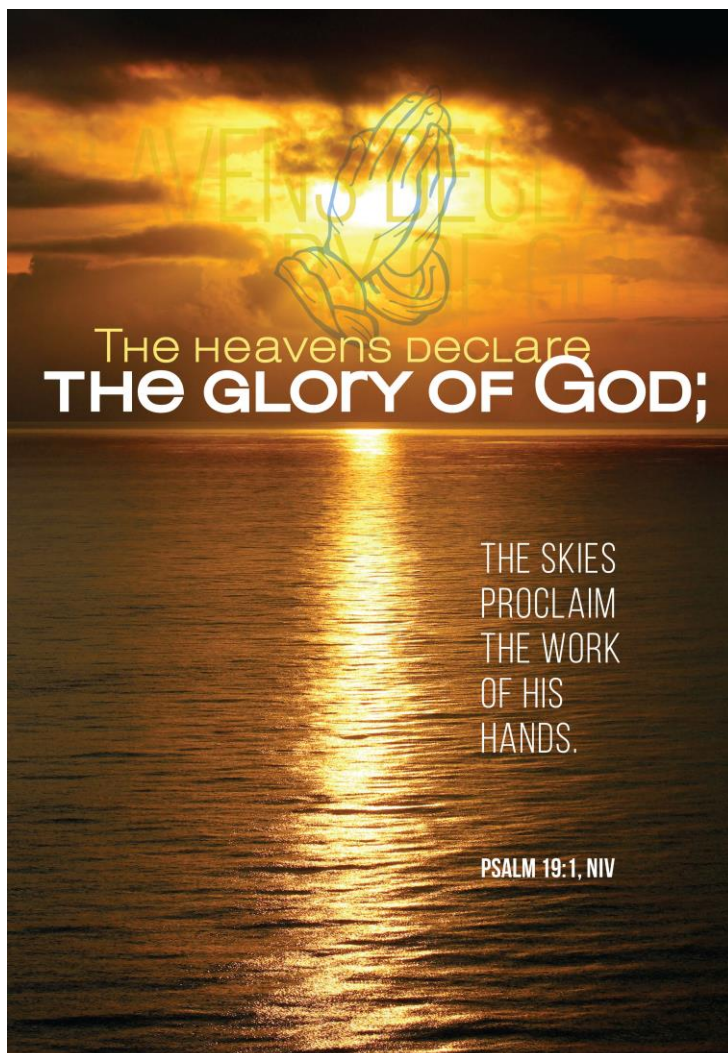

## Pastor's Message



*Jesus said, "Let the little children come to me, and do not hinder them, for the kingdom of heaven belongs to such as these." - Matthew 19:14*

Last weekend I had the privilege of leading worship at Empire Grove Campmeeting Association in Poland, Maine. It is one of the oldest Methodist Campmeeting Associations that is still active and has remained so since the 1840s. While they do have children's programming during the summer, they do not offer childcare or Sunday School during the Sunday Evening Vespers Services (of which I was leading). That meant that my very active 4 ("AND A HALF!") year old was going to have to sit through the full worship service. To be honest I was not very hopeful that he would make it through without causing a ruckus because he had never done so before. My parents were there to help, but "Memere magic" only goes so far.

Friends, not only did this child sit quietly through the entire worship service, but when it came to the Prayers of the People/Joys and Concerns, he raised his hand to share this prayer: "I would like to pray for people that are sad. That maybe God, who lives in their heart, could be present with them." The prayer in and of itself was beautiful, but it was EXTRA amazing because I had just preached a sermon on God's presence and my 4.5 yr old got it. Even while playing quietly with his hot wheels cars, he was listening and absorbing faith, theology, and God around him through worship.

Have you ever been amazed by the profound words or actions that can come from a child? Jesus knew that the faith of children was deep and that they had a unique glimpse of the kingdom of God. As the children in your life have their last weeks of school and begin Summer Vacation, I invite you to listen closely to them. What wisdom do they have to teach us adults? How might they help us or challenge us in our own faith? How is God working through children to bring about the kingdom of God?

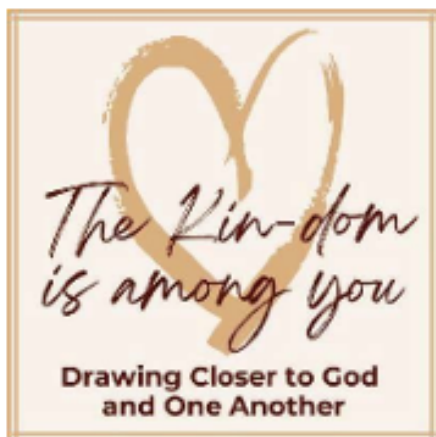
# Register now for Mission u

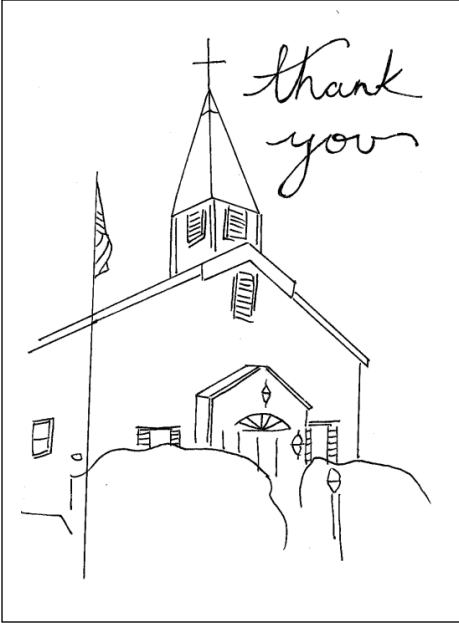

The **Silent Auction** is a large part of the Harvest Fair. Each year, we have gift baskets, gift cards and other new items on our auction tables. Last year, we filled Fellowship Hall with more than 100 items up for auction. To get an early start, we are asking for donations of baskets and gift cards. Do you have any gifts that you received and never used? We can use those items as well. Can you go to local businesses and ask for donations? If making baskets is not your thing, we will have lists of items that you could donate toward a basket that we will put together.

## FAMILY FEAST

Serve protein-packed waffles for a family breakfast on **FATHER'S DAY** or any special occasion.

### What you need:

- Adult help
- Waffle maker
- Blender
- 1 cup old-fashioned oats
- 1 cup cottage cheese
- 6 eggs
- Cooking spray
- Diced strawberries
- Powdered sugar



### What you do:

1. With adult help, preheat the waffle maker.
2. In the blender, add oats and cottage cheese. Crack eggs in a separate bowl, then add to the blender. Pulse to combine the mixture. Then blend on medium speed for 10 seconds.
3. Coat the waffle maker with cooking spray. Spoon about 1/3 cup batter onto the iron and close.
4. Carefully remove the waffle when it's golden brown. Repeat with remaining batter.
5. Top with strawberries and powdered sugar. Makes about 6 waffles.
